Teacher Leadership Program Vision

Vision of the TLC

 The Johnston Teacher Leadership Project will empower teachers to promote quality instructional practices that will assist in creating a culture of excellence to promote the academic growth of all students.

Leadership Roles

Instructional Coach - 10 positions

 Coach (reflect, model and train) to help teachers identify student learning needs, implement high yield instructional strategies, and effectively utilize data to make instructional decisions. Develop and implement professional development. Participate in new teacher induction through mentoring and providing professional learning.

Leadership Roles

Lead Teacher - 32 positions

 Coach teachers in learning effective teaching strategies. Advocate for building and individual teachers' professional development needs.
 Design and plan building level professional development. Facilitate teacher collaboration to increase student achievement. Participate in the teacher induction process by providing learning opportunities and mentoring.

Leadership Roles

- Model Teachers 56 positions
- Create job-embedded professional development by modeling high-yield instructional strategies. Provide professional learning opportunities specific to the needs of new teachers.

Goals

- Attract able and promising new teachers by offering competitive starting salaries and offering short-term and long-term professional development and leadership opportunities
- Retain effective teachers by providing enhanced career opportunities.
- Promote collaboration by developing and supporting opportunities for teachers in schools and school districts statewide to learn from each other.

- Reward professional growth and effective teaching by providing pathways for career opportunities that come with increased leadership responsibilities and involve increased compensation.
- Improve student achievement by strengthening instruction.
