What can "tests" tell us?

- What the student knows/can do <u>today under these</u> <u>conditions.</u>
- How this student's <u>single</u> performance compares to other children his/her age.
- How this student's <u>single</u> performance compares to previous performances.

What can "tests" NOT tell us?

• Is the child...

• motivated to learn? motivated to take tests?

• What other areas of talent...

• does s/he possess? want to pursue?

• Is s/he well-rounded academically, emotionally and socially?

• Is the student happy at school?

How does JCSD use "tests"?

- To analyze effectiveness of instruction and materials over the whole district.
- To report JCSD performance to Department of Education.
- To analyze/evaluate appropriate programming for individual students, as part of a comprehensive profile of data.

Elementary Tests

Required

Iowa Assessments (gr. 2+)
Measures and Academic Progress (MAP) (gr. 3+)


Selected students: CogAT (gr. 2,4 or 7)

Secondary Tests

- Required exams: IA and MAP
- Additional exams available
- PLAN/ACT
- PSAT/SAT
- AP Exams

Iowa Assessments

- Standard scores / percentiles reported
- Used to report to State about school's yearly progress and to measure individual student growth
- Often are not good measures of ELP potential/achievement due to "hitting the ceiling"



• Theoretically more accurate for students, less "hitting the ceiling"

MAPs, cont' d

- Reported as raw scores (RIT) and percentile
- Also labeled Non Proficient/Proficient/Advanced.
- Used to report to State about student performance
- Students often have preference for MAP or IA. Many do not perform at exactly the same level on both.

Cognitive Abilities Test

- Used for recommended students gr 2, 4 or 7
- Includes verbal, math and nonverbal reasoning
- Reported as standard score
- Can help identify relative need for services amongst those who have "hit the ceiling" on IA/MAP

PLAN (pre-ACT)

- Available Sophomore year
- Includes shortened, adapted ACT plus a career interest component
- Designed to assist in planning for college
- Subject areas: reading comprehension, math, science, English skills
- Reported as raw score out of 32

PSAT (pre-SAT)

- Available Junior year
- Contains shortened, adapted SAT exam
- Subject areas: math, reading comprehension, English skills
- Gateway to the National Merit Scholarship Program

ACT

- Achievement test designed to predict college success
- Usually taken as a junior, but may be recommended for 8th/9th as a baseline.
- Reported as raw score out of 36
- Subject areas: math, science, reading comprehension, English skills
- Optional writing component



- Usually taken junior or senior year, but could be taken earlier.
- Subject areas: math, reading comprehension, English
- Required writing section
- Reported as raw score out of 1600, divided between math (800) and verbal (800).
- Writing score is separate

AP Exams

- Possible credit awarded by colleges.
- Measures mastery of designated curriculum for each course
- College level classes
- 12 AP courses at HS, gr. 10 12.
- Students may take exam without taking course
- Several JHS courses offer dual credit with DMACC, so may not need exam

Optional exams administered at JHS


- PLAN/PSAT yearly in October
- ACT five times a year (Oct, Dec, Feb, April, June)
- SAT yearly in October
- AP exams yearly in May

Other Options


- Belin/Blank Center in Iowa City offers Explore (gr. 4-6), ACT and SAT for grades 7+ through the BESTS program.
- SAT may be available at other sites in the metro. Check the website collegeboard.com

BESTS

- Belin/Blank program offering above-level testing to students grades 3-9
- Designed to better estimate potential and achievement for students who have "hit the ceiling"
- Enables access to Belin/Blank summer programs and mailing list
- Includes Explore, ACT and SAT
