## **Parent-Teacher Conferences**

As the calendar turns to November, we get closer to the end of the first trimester. Our teachers and staff are working to prepare student progress reports and ready materials for parent teacher conferences. Conferences will be held on Tuesday, November 15 and Thursday, November 17. Beaver Creek historically has 99% attendance at Parent Teacher conferences, and we expect the same this fall. Conferences are one of the most important methods we have to share your child's progress thus far.

If you have not yet signed up for a conference with your student's teacher, please do so by following the link below to utilize our online scheduling system:

At the conference, parents will receive the student's progress report, which include skills rubrics on critical grade level standards and benchmarks. The rubrics vary by content area, and your child's teacher will be able to explain what the scores mean during the conference. It is important to remember that the rubric scores do not equate letter grades. One premise of standards based grading is meeting the standard, or the skill, described by the standard by the end of the school year. It is appropriate and probable that students will not be achieving the year end standard in November.

# Safety and Security at Beaver Creek

Visitors and guests, including parents, will be asked to present a valid Driver's License when they visit our building. There will be no exceptions to this request. All visitors will then be issued a date-sensitive visitor badge containing their identification information that must be worn while on school grounds. Minors that do not have a valid state-issued ID will be allowed to visit, as long as they are accompanied by an adult that has checked in with our procedures. Once you have registered within our electronic sign-in procedure, you should not need to provide an ID each time you visit. However, you will still need to check-in at the office to receive a visitor badge containing your personal information. We recommend always having your Driver's License available should we need to rescan.

Students should not be dropped off at the front entrance or the parent drop off doors before 8:25. We do not have staff members available to supervise students until 8:30. If you need to drop off your child before 8:30, you will need to use KTC.

In the morning, we expect students to be able to walk to their classroom by themselves. If you need to visit the classroom, you will need to follow the check in procedures outlined above. If you want to meet with the teacher, we ask that you schedule a meeting in advance, as arrival time is busy for teachers and staff.

Thank you for your support in keeping Beaver Creek a safe, secured environment for student learning.

## It's getting cold outside. When do the students go outside for recess, or stay inside for recess?

Brrrrrrrr .. it's getting cold out and winter is on its way. At Beaver Creek, we plan on outside recess if the wind chill is 5 degrees or above during recess time. On colder days, the windchill is constantly monitored and outdoor recess is scheduled based on the temperature and conditions. We ask that students be prepared for outside recess each school day. This includes outerwear, hat, mittens or gloves, and boots and snow pants, if there is snow on the ground. Please label all items with your students first and last name.

Partnership Place is located at 5870 Merle Hay Road, Suite D (west of the Johnston Post Office. Packages are available starting Tuesday, November 1st. Hours of operation are Tuesday and Thursdays from 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 10:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. The Partnership Place is closed on holidays and Holiday weekends.
