## MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Summit Families:

After our first week of 5 day in-person learning for students at Summit, I want to share a few observations:

- 1. We are practicing incredibly stringent cleaning procedures during the day and each evening.
- 2. Students and staff are wearing masks with almost no exceptions in our building exceptions are addressed quickly.
- 3. Monday was like the first day of school for over 50 students. We welcomed back online learners and introduced a number of new students to our district and school. It was also the first day of online learning for 11 students.
- 4. The parent pick up and drop off line continues to become more efficient.
- 5. The "Week-at-a-Glance" and preview videos continue to provide guidance to online learners.
- 6. We are taking contact tracing seriously including spending hours each day pouring over seating charts, interviewing teachers and students, measuring distancing, and ensuring who did or did not wear masks. In the end, we submit this information to the Polk County Health Department and they determine who is quarantined.
- 7. Students have responded incredibly well to these requirements and necessary adjustments.

We are working hard at Summit to address your concerns, deliver meaningful learning and keep students safe.

#### **COUNSELOR CORNER**

Summit Middle School administered the Strengths and Difficulties Questionnaire (SDQ) to students who selected to participate on October 27th and October 29th. This survey assisted parents and students with identifying areas of strengths and difficulties, or areas of challenge, not only in school, but at home and within relationships with adults and



peers. Your students results will be mailed home to you so you are aware of the screenings outcomes. If your child has an area of significant concern identified through the screening you would have received a phone call from a JCSD staff member to discuss this with you.
