MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Summit Families:

As we move into the month of October, Summit Staff Members continue to work on improving in person and online learning for students. Some of the improvements you should be seeing already include the following:

- 1. Fewer emails from teachers and the building
- 2. An email on Fridays outlining work that will be required for the coming week
- 3. An increased emphasis on classroom learning and activities when students are at school
- 4. Increased communication between online teachers and students
- 5. School clubs offered to both hybrid and online learners (the two most recent are Math Counts and Spanish Club)

Some additional adjustments we plan to make:

- 1. For hybrid students, using a balance of Edmentum assignments and classroom assignments to determine grades
- 2. An improved format to clearly communicate assignments in related arts courses
- 3. An appropriate art course for middle school online learners
- 4. Additional clubs for hybrid and online learners
- 5. An improved ability to determine what is appropriate for one week of activities in Edmentum

I appreciate the feedback I have received from families at Summit. Our staff uses every minute of our Wednesday early outs to adjust and improve in regard to the items I listed above. I will continue to work to improve the experience at Summit during this unusual and difficult situation.

THE SECOND ANNUAL UN-FUNDRAISER

How are the dollars used? The funds will be used in many ways throughout the year, like teachers grants, teacher appreciation, school supplies for students in need, and our amazing 3D Printers.

As many of you know, necessary PPE for health care professionals was not readily available at the beginning of the Covid-19 Pandemic last spring. As a result, the STEM teachers at Summit Middle School responded by using our 3D printers to create over 400 face shields. It is our hope that the Summit PTO fundraiser can help our STEM teachers purchase new 3D printers to replace those that are broken or no longer in prime working order due to intense printing. In addition, now that we know what we are capable of printing, we want to upgrade the quality of printers in our STEM room. This will not only support our STEM department with working printers but will also improve the quality of real-world projects in our STEM classes. We will also repair and continue to use the existing printers where possible.

Is there any fun? Absolutely! As we meet these totals, the students (and parents) will be able to celebrate:

Opportunity for FREE Virtual After-School Music Classes through Des Moines Music Coalition (DMMC) offered for ages 11-17!






